entered there. He is resting from his work, just as God did after the creation. Let us do our best to go into that place of rest, too, being careful not to disobey God as the children of Israel did."

The practice of resting is emphasized in the scriptures as needed for our health and creativity. God can provide all that we need for refreshment and renewal. My prayer for each of you is that you schedule time off this summer to do... nothing. To sleep in. To go on vacation. To read a book or go to the movies. To go to the beach or hike in the mountains, to go fishing, golfing, maybe play volleyball. To care for your garden or finish the quilt that's been on your to-do list for a year (that's one thing I hope to finally finish!). To sit out on a warm night with a glass of wine or a cup of tea and look up and enjoy the beauty of the stars. Your mind, body, and spirit will be rested, refreshed, and renewed, and you'll be more excited about what God has for you, your family and our congregation.

Deciding to make the change to stop the perpetual cycle of "doing, doing, doing" requires a deliberate decision to stop and take a break. Making rest and renewal as important as checking off all the tasks on our to-do list will have a positive impact on our lives. How we sustain ourselves emotionally and physically is vital to our well-being.

Something else that is vitally important to our lives is time spent in prayer, reflection and conversation with God. *In 2 Corinthians 5 we read, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" In Isaiah 40: "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."*

God's desire is that while you are on this earth and in your body, you will be renewed in your spirit every day. We have been given the ability, through the Holy Spirit, to rest in

God's presence, and to experience his love. We can have the same experience as Paul wrote about in 2 Corinthians 4:16, "inwardly we are renewed day by day".

So, how can we experience the renewal Paul speaks about? How do we rest in God's presence and open ourselves to the power and creativity that has been given to us since the moment of creation?

First, it starts with trusting that God will reveal his wisdom and love when we pray and meditate on the Word. In Jesus' prayer found in John 17:24-26, Jesus asks God to love us with the same love with which he loves Jesus. "Father, I desire that they also, whom You have given Me, be with Me where I am, so that they may see My glory which You have given Me, for You loved Me before the foundation of the world. "O righteous Father, although the world has not known You, yet I have known You; and these have known that You sent Me; and I have made Your name known to them, and will make it known, so that the love with which You loved Me may be in them, and I in them."

That is a powerful prayer! Jesus wants all of us to share in the same intimacy with God that he does. When we make time to be with God, he will fill us with his presence. Trust that God will embrace you with open arms.

Also, very important in experiencing renewal is being present in worship. When we are present in worship, we experience a renewed sense of vision and purpose. If you travel this summer, find a church to worship in and share with our family some of their practices. God might have a word for us from the experiences found in other places of worship.

Finally, spend time reading God's Word, and let it fill your soul, change and inspire you to ask great questions, and receive the gift of knowledge that God promises to give when asked with an open heart.



Know that when you wake up every morning, God is waiting for you to spend time with him and to allow him the opportunity to reveal wisdom, creativity, and joy to you through the Holy Spirit. Whatever you choose to do this summer, I hope that you

make time to play and time to pray. I look forward to hearing all the great stories of **What I Did Over My Summer Vacation** and I also look forward to an exciting fall sharing ministry with each of you, refreshed, renewed and recharged!

QUARTERLY VESTRY FOCUS

Highlights from the Vestry Meetings January through April 2019

January: Treasurer Dave Ackerman reviewed the financial reports for year-end 2018 and the 2019 Proposed Budget. He projected a deficit in 2019. After discussion, Dave was asked to submit a revised budget for Vestry review and presentation at the Annual Meeting.

Music Director Soon Yeon Chung briefed the Vestry on the current state of the organ and pianos. Repairs were discussed as well as the prohibitive cost of a new organ.

Annual Reports were completed and submitted. At the annual meeting the wardens will remind the attendees that the current roster of vestry members will be maintained until a permanent minister has been hired.

Rev. Cathie Studwell updated the vestry on a number of her ongoing initiatives including "Coffee, Christianity, and Conversation," periodic visits with AA, the Parish Directory, and others.

February: Dave reported unanticipated past-due pledge payments which will help our forecasted income.

Warden Kathy Gabrielle referenced the proposed role of a part-time Sexton and the need for the Vestry to approve the job description.

Search Discernment Committee co-chair Ghada Harb reported on the status of the Parish Profile and the need to have releases signed for use of children's pictures in it.

Rev. Cathie updated the Vestry on her ongoing initiatives and reviewed the calendar of Parish Life events. She and Kathy will visit the Ho-Ho-Kus train station to offer "Ashes To Go" on Ash Wednesday morning.

Kathy briefed the Vestry on various topics from the Diocesan Convention.

March: Dave commented on favorable income offset by slightly higher than forecast costs.

Church Leader University: Dave shared his favorable impressions of the Diocese's Church Leader University, commenting that St. Bart's needs to catch up on our use of technology. We need to attract a volunteer with strong social media skills. Cathie discussed the Small and Thriving Congregations topic, noting that the future of the church will be small churches. Rather than think we need to be like others, St. Bart's needs to create and pursue our own unique path.

Rev. Cathie reviewed upcoming initiatives, including Easter Week activities, confirmation of our candidates Katie and Lily, and the fundraising music concert.

The Vestry voted to outsource our payroll processing to ADP.

April: The Finance Committee reported that gains during the first quarter of the year increased our portfolio value by over \$13,800.

Wayne Kamidoi noted our lack of success in getting publicity in the Town Journal.

At Soon's request, the piano will be moved next to the choir pews for the May concert.

Rev. Cathie discussed upcoming activities including Youth Sunday, Children's Ministry Workshop, and the plan to again provide bottled water to the Memorial Day Parade participants.

Kathy Gabrielle agreed to canvass the Vestry on the proposal to hire a Sexton and to advertise the position through posters around the church.
