

Celebration of the Holy Eucharist Rite II (BCP 361)

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who on the first day of the week overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life.

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever say this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. *AMEN*.





Meeting God through the Window April Window Found in the Nave





The six windows in the Nave symbolize the articles of the Apostle's Creed beginning with the window nearest to the Altar.

"WHO WAS CONCEIVED BY THE HOLY GHOST, BORN OF THE VIRGIN MARY: SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE: WAS CRUCIFIED, DEAD, AND BURIED: HE DESCENDED INTO HELL:"

The familiar figure of the Holy Ghost as a dove, descending from Heaven has its basis in Holy Scripture. The over-shadowing of the Blessed Virgin Mary by the divine power is expressed by the descending rays upon the monogram M, for Mary. Her purity and virginity are that of the lily seen so many times in paintings of the Annunciation. The Star of Bethlehem is at the upper left, and the ageless cry of the prophet proclaims the coming of the Son of God: "Unto us a Child is born!" After a long life of communion with God in thought, word and deed, our Lord offered Himself for us and for our salvation on the Cross of Calvary. The instruments of His Passion surround the Cross; the sponge on the reed to satiate His thirst with vinegar, the spear which was thrust into His side to insure the Victim's death, the crown of thorns which graced His royal head, the nails which were driven into His feet and hands, and the sling whereby His body was lowered to the ground. The accusation against Jesus appears in the inscription above I N R I (Jesus Nazarenus Rex Judaeorum).


